Remember that all outside decorations and items should be stored in a safe place so they don't blow around and become projectiles.

#### Prepare Your Home

- Take your valuables and important papers with you
- Turn off all utilities (Water, Electricity & Gas) at the main switch
- · Lock windows and doors
- Remove all items that can become windborne and store inside
- Fill your gas tank
- Advise friends and relatives of where you are going

Please note.... you are not obligated to go to a special needs shelter once registered if you have made other safe and secure arrangements.

**Trash Collection Days: Trash** collection is on **Tuesdays** and **Fridays**. Recycling is on Wednesdays. Remember to call the City of Pinellas Park to schedule any oversize trash pick-up: (727) 369-0690. Waste Management will not pick up furniture, old carpet, TV's, or building supplies.

- Recycling & Household Electronics & Chemical Collections is located at 2855 109th Ave N, St. Pete, FL 33716. No charge to drop off electronics, TV's, old paint, etc.
- Pinellas County Solid Waste is located at 3095 114th Ave. S, St Pete, FL 3371. Cost is \$10, cash. Drop off all building supplies, old windows, you name it!

**WEEDS/CONDITION OF MOBILE:** Now is the time of year for weeds, they seem to multiply overnight. If you do not make arrangements with someone and the weeds become an issue, or the mobile needs to cleaned, etc., you will receive a letter asking you to correct the violation. If the work does not get done, the resident will be charged a service fee of \$25.00 per hour with a one (1) hour minimum for each time work needs to be done. It is only fair for the residents maintaining their homes & lawns on a year-round basis. Thanks for your cooperation.

PARKING ON THE STREET/SIDEWALKS: Do not park golf carts or cars on the sidewalk. This is a Park rule as well as a City ordinance. Street parking is only allowed to accommodate carport or unit maintenance. Please do not park directly across from someone else's driveway, as it makes it extremely difficult for them to exit the driveway. Please use common sense and do not park near or on corners or close to intersections. We encourage parking on the same side of the street to avoid traffic having to "zig-zag" to get by, or be completely obstructed.



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
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To our valued customers:

**PROPER ATTIRE:** Please abide by the Park rules requiring men to wear t-shirts or button up shirts and ladies to have cover ups over bathing suits when you leave your property. Also, dry clothing, including shoes, are required when entering the club house.

PLEASE DO NOT, UNDER ANY CIRCUMSTANCES FEED STRAY ANIMALS. While you are trying to do a good thing, you are attracting UNWANTED CRITTERS TO THE PARK, and to your neighbor's properties. <u>DO NOT FEED STRAY ANIMALS: Sec. 14-30.</u>
- Public Nuisance Feeding Animals: A citation or \$148 fine for a violation of this section may be issued based upon: (4) Placing food or garbage, allowing the placement of food or garbage, or offering food or garbage in such a manner that it attracts cats, dogs, raccoons, coyotes or other wildlife, thereby creating a public nuisance.

#### Safety Tips:

- Call the police immediately if you witness any suspicious activity at all! Be prepared to give as many details as possible. The Pinellas Park Police non-emergency phone number is 727-369-7864. Call 911 (in dire emergencies.)
- Keep outside lights during hours of darkness, every night.
- Lock your cars. Don't leave anything in your vehicle that you don't want to lose. Never hide a spare set of keys anywhere in your vehicle.
- Keep your outdoor shed locked at all times.
- Never open your door to someone you do not know, or solicitors.
- LOOK OUT FOR ONE ANOTHER.

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#### **Lift Station Monthly Reminder – Important**

LUSHONLY: Body waste and toilet paper. It is highly recommended that only one ply toilet paper be used to prevent clogging the toilet.



**DON'T FLUSH:** Tampons- Sanitary Pads – Diapers – Depends – Swiffer Cloths – Dust Cloths – Wet Wipes – Kleenex – Food, etc.

When we flush, the waste goes into a **holding tank** that has two pumps to expel the waste **<u>UP</u>** and **<u>OU</u>**T into the Pinellas Park sewage system. When any of the above gets flushed, it clogs the pump, overheats it, and burns out the motor.



#### **Recipes for the month**

#### Salted Caramel Chocolate Cheesecake

For the Cheesecake:

2 pkg (8oz each) cream cheese, softened

2/3 cup granulated sugar

pinch of salt

2 large eggs

1/3 cup sour cream

1/3 cup heavy cream

1 tsp vanilla

FOR THE CAKE:

1 recipe chocolate layer cake (9inch layers)

- homemade or cake mix is fine

FOR THE FROSTING:

1 cup unsalted butter, softened

1/2 cup caramel sauce (homemade caramel sauce

or jarred is fine)

4 cup powdered sugar

2 Tbsp milk

1/2 tsp kosher salt

FOR THE GANACHE:

4 oz dark chocolate

1/3 cup heavy cream

2 Tbsp caramel sauce pinch of kosher salt



#### Directions:

For the Cheesecake:

Preheat oven to 325 degrees. Using a large roasting pan on the lower 2/3 of the oven, preheat the pan too!

Prepare springform pan by wrapping bottom of pan (outside) with double layer of foil. Spray pan with nonstick baking spray and line bottom (inside) with a circle of parchment paper. Meanwhile, boil a kettle of water to use later.

Beat cream cheese with granulate sugar for 2-3 minutes until creamy. Add in salt and eggs, one at a time, beating well after each addition.

Beat in sour cream, heavy cream and vanilla. Pour into prepared 9inch springform pan. Place



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pan in center of preheated roasting pan in the oven. Pour boiling water slowly into the roasting pan, until there is about an inch of water coming up the sides of the springform pan.

Bake cheesecake for 45 minutes. Turn oven off and let cheesecake sit in oven for an additional 30 minutes. Remove and cool completely on counter.

When cooled, transfer entire springform pan into the freezer for several hours or overnight. I put it in freezer for about 2 hours. \*\*If using within 24 hours, feel free to just refrigerate cheesecake! FOR THE CAKE LAYER:

Prepare chocolate cake according to package directions for 9 inch cake. Or, like me, prepare a homemade dark chocolate layer cake using THIS recipe

#### FOR THE FROSTING:

Beat butter in a large mixing bowl for 2-3 minutes, until fluffy. Add caramel sauce, powdered sugar, milk and kosher salt.

Beat for 4-5 minutes until soft and creamy.

#### TO ASSEMBLE:

On a cake platter, lay one layer of chocolate cake, top with the cheesecake. Then add the other layer of chocolate cake. Spread frosting over entire cake, sides and top.

Refrigerate frosted cake while you prepare the chocolate ganache.

#### FOR THE GANACHE:

In a microwave safe bowl, combine dark chocolate with heavy cream. Heat 30 seconds. Stir and heat an additional 30 seconds. Whisk for several minutes until smooth. Allow to cool slightly. Once cooled. Spread over top of chilled cake. Drizzle with remaining 2 Tbsp of caramel sauce and sprinkle with a pinch of kosher salt. Refrigerate cake until ready to serve!


